Bluefield, WV - Thelma M. Wilson, 89 of 4208 Beacon Street, Bluefield, WV died Monday March 14, 2011 in a Bluefield hospital Born July 29, 1921 in Graham, VA, she was a daughter of the late Lilburn Wilson and Lucy Jane Shewey Wilson. Miss Wilson had been a resident of Beckley for fifty years, until moving to Bluefield to be cared for by her niece. She was a member of St. Mary's Methodist Church in Beckley. Miss Wilson was a graduate of Bluefield High School, Concord University and University of Virginia. She had worked at Bluefield Sanitarium and St. Lukes Hospital before moving to Beckley where she worked at Beckley Appalachian Regional Hospital. After her tenure at BARH, she was the Director of the Raleigh County Medical Society, from where she retired at the age of 81. Miss Wilson was the last surviving member of her immediate family. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by three sisters, Edna Brooks, Billie Shrewsbury and Peggy Wilson; and one brother, Lilburn "Bud" Wilson. Survivors include her niece, Abby Donchatz and husband Thomas and their daughter Michaela, with whom Miss Wilson had made her home for the past year and a half; and one brother-in-law, Barnes Brooks of Princeton. She is also survived by numerous other nieces and nephews. In accordance with Miss Wilson's wishes, her body will be cremated and a private burial will be held at Woodlawn Memorial Park.
