Bluefield, WV- Dallas M. "Buster" Johnson, 77, of Bluefield, VA, died Tuesday March 4, 2008 at a Bluefield hospital. He was born in Crumpler, WV on May 27, 1930, a son of the late C.H. Johnson and May Maxwell Johnson Earnest. Mr. Johnson served in the U.S. Army as a Master Sergeant From 1953 until 1955 serving in Greenland for one year. His employment included S&S Corporation in Richlands, VA as an underground salesman, President and Co-owner of Mine Pump and Supply and Company, Co-owner of West City Mine Supply in Benton, Ill. After retirement, he was associated with Dave Shields Co. as a realtor. Mr. Johnson was a member of the Masonic Lodge #85 A.F. & A.M., and the Bluefield Elks Lodge #269. He was also a member of Trinity United Methodist Church.

In addition to his parents, Mr. Johnson was preceded in death by one son, Timothy Knox Johnson; and one brother, Clarence H. Johnson, Jr.

Survivors include his wife Judy K. Johnson, of the home; and one son, Todd Johnson of Cornelius, NC.

Funeral services will be conducted on Friday March 7, 2008 at 2:00 p.m. in the Mercer Funeral Home Chapel with Dr. Charles Miller and Dr. Don Scott officiating. The family will receive friends at the funeral home on Friday from 12:30 p.m. until the service hour.
