Bluefield, VA- Danny Dean Albert, 58, of 112-A Jefferson Street, Bluefield, VA, died Sunday December 13, 2009 at a Bluefield hospital. Born February 23, 1951 in Bluefield, WV, he was the son of the late Everette Payton Albert and Elva Richardson Albert. Mr. Albert was a member of the Covenant Reform Baptist Church in Bluefield, WV. He served eleven years between the U.S. Army and U.S. Airforce. He received three honorable discharges and attained the rank of Senior Airman (SrA). He was a Civil Engineer in the Air Force and also worked as a civilian Airline Mechanic. During his service to our country he served in Germany and Turkey, and received the Presidential Unit Ribbon, Air Force Longevity Ribbon, Air Force Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Ribbon, National Defense Service Medal, and the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award. He was a former Crew Chief for Strategic Air Command (SAC). Mr. Albert was a graduate of Northfork Elkhorn High School and attended New River Community College. He was an honors graduate from Cheyenne Aeroteck. Survivors include his son, Bryan Keith Taylor and his wife Kelly Rasnake Taylor of Bluefield, VA; two sisters, Joanne Albert Ercoline and her husband Alex of Bluefield, WV and Susan Lynn Doss and her husband Terry of Bluefield, WV; five grandchildren, Payton, Annalea, Madeline, Jillian and Jacob Taylor; four nieces and one nephew. Funeral services will be conducted on Wednesday December 16, 2009 at 11:00 a.m. from the Mercer Funeral Home Chapel with Pastor Lee McKinnon officiating. The family will receive friends at the funeral home from 10:00 a.m. until the service hour on

Wednesday. Burial will follow at 2:00 p.m. at Belmont Cemetery, Route 114, Christiansburg, VA where family members and friends of the family will serve as pallbearers.
