Bluefield, WV- Ennis Graham Cooper, 75, of Bluefield, WV, died on October 31, 2013 at Princeton Community Hospital. She was born in Bethlehem, PA to the late William R. and Elsie Lilly Graham. Ennis graduated from Beaver High School in Bluefield, WV in 1955 and Randolph Macon Woman's College in Lynchburg, VA in 1959. She also attended the Latin American Institute in New York, NY, graduating in 1960. Following her education, Ennis lived in New York City, where she worked for ABC International Institute, Georg Jensen, and the American Association of Advertisers. She married the late Mark F. Cooper, and in 1968, they moved to Seattle, WA, where Ennis worked in the timber industry. Following her retirement, she remained active in the Women in Timber Association for many years. In 2002, Ennis moved back to her hometown, Bluefield, WV to be nearer to family and friends. Ennis is survived by her sister, Margaret Stuart Graham (Dale) Black; nieces, Ennis (Ken) McCrery, Temple McNeer, and Tracy Cooper (Dave) Norlen; and nephew, Scott (Ede) Cooper Also surviving are special friends: Bob Little, Tommy McMullin, Angie Brown, and Elizabeth Tynes. A memorial service will be held on Monday November 4, 2013 at 2:00 p.m. at Mercer Funeral Home with Craig Hammond officiating. Visitation will be held an hour before the service.
