Born September 30, 1962 in Bluefield, WV Greg was a son of the late Warren G. and Florence Stone Shrewsberry. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Bluefield, VA and was the Dean of the Bluefield Campus of New River Community and Technical College. Greg was a 1980 Graduate of Bluefield High School. He graduated from the University of South Carolina and did his Graduate School at Marshall University. At the time of his death, he was the President of Bluefield Civitan Club, was a member of Bluefield Elks Lodge # 269 and did volunteer work for the Salvation Army and Bluefield Union Mission. Greg is survived by a sister Karen Thompson and her husband Wade of Columbia, SC, a brother Larry Shrewsberry and his wife Gloria of Barboursville, WV, nephews Drew Thompson of Columbia, SC and James Perry of Barboursville, and a niece Stephanie Perry also of Barboursville, WV.
