James Ronald Haga, age 81, passed away Monday, July 26, 2021.

"Ronnie" was born in Tazewell County, Virginia on March 25, 1940 the eldest child of James C. and Mary E. (Lester) Haga. Raised in Pocahontas, Virginia, he enlisted in the Army at age 17 and was later stationed in Germany and Ft. Carson, Colorado. While in Europe, he was awarded the Soldier's Medal for his actions to extinguish a vehicle on fire in the transport of nuclear warheads. Ronnie left the military for law enforcement working for the Aurora Colorado Police Department, Virginia State Police, Thornton Police Department and as a chief of police in Cozad, Nebraska and Derby, Kansas. He also enjoyed many years working construction, commercial fishing on the James River near Surry, Virginia, gardening, flying and reading.

Ronnie is preceded in death by his parents.
