Jordan Lee Rose, 39, died February 18, 2021 in a Beckley Hospital. He was born June 6, 1981, in Princeton to Theresa Brown Baria and Ron Rose. He was raised by his mother and stepfather, Quent Baria, in Bluefield, VA. He is also survived by his stepmother, Pamela Powers-Crabtree of Nashville, TN.

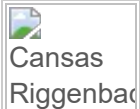
