



## Randy Lamb

March 28, 1950 - January 11, 2017

Bluefield, VA- Randy Lamb, a resident of Bluefield, VA, died on January 11, 2017 at the age of 66. He became sick in December and died from complications of an unexpected surgery.

Randy is survived by his wife, Nancy; his daughter, Leslie Nagle; his son in law, Harold Nagle; grandsons, Noah and Reichen Nagle; and his brother, Jim Lamb.

Randy's love of dance was apparent when he opened his first studio at age 17 in Mullens, WV. He founded the Bluefield Dance Theater in 1974. He worked on the dance education circuit for Dance Troupe as a national convention instructor, dance competition judge and director. He was a performer in Honey in the Rock and danced in the movie Dirty Dancing.

Mr. Lamb was dedicated to arts education for 49 years and was proud to share his love of dance with thousands of students. He touched many lives and trained dancers who have gone on to dance professionally, as well as become dance educators. His true passion was working with children and watching them grow into young adults. The Nutcracker ballet was an annual performance that he always looked forward to presenting to the community. He loved to see the excitement on the faces of many young children. He took great pride in training excellent dancers, but most importantly, he taught them about love, compassion and team work.

Visitation will be from 2:00-3:30 p.m. on Sunday, January 15, 2017 at First Baptist Church, 1325 Augusta St., Bluefield, WV. The celebration of Randy's

life will begin at the church at 4:00 pm. with Rev. Jonathan Rockness officiating. Private burial will be at Roselawn Memorial Gardens in Princeton, WV.

“As a little girl, just six years old, I’d rush to the front of the convention halls all across Texas to get a spot in the front row of THE Randy Lamb’s classes. I’d sit at the edge of the stage and watch him walk up the stairs with his bag, slip on his ballet shoes, and wave to us little ones eagerly waiting for him to look over at us. He was one of my favorite instructors on the convention circuit – so silly and joyful, always smiling. I loved dancing. I loved taking classes from instructors all across the US. And I loved Mr. Lamb.

*My family moved from Texas to North Carolina when I was nine years old. I was fortunate enough to start training with some incredible dance icons whom Mr. Lamb had actually worked very closely with on the convention circuit. Many of you have probably heard of them – Barry Kyle, Elliott Bradley, and the incredible Ray Hollingsworth. Years later, while I was in high school, Mr. Lamb bought my dance studio and became MY dance teacher. How amazingly awesome is that?!*

*The memories I have of Randy as my teacher bring so many smiles to my face. There was this one dance where our costume was an American flag unitard. I was a bit of chunky girl, and I’ll never forget him laughing and telling me nobody will be looking at my red, white, and blue behind as long as my technique was on point....5,6,7,8. HaHa. That same dance had every prop you could imagine – flags, streamers, tambourines, hats, and more. It was total chaos in the wings, but the number was brilliant...and so was he. I’d come home from dance at night, and hop onto AOL. SOHAPPY180 would send me an IM – “Good job tonight, Showbiz. Get some sleep.” He’d tease me sometimes on Friday nights – “It’s 2am, Showbiz, what are you doing up so late? We have rehearsal in the morning?” I’d say – “LOL, SOHAPPY180, what are YOU doing up so late? You have rehearsal too.” Mr. Lamb also trusted me and believed in me enough to let me teach some of my own classes. He mentored me. We’d chat about where I struggled, and he’d give me tips on how to better connect with the little ones...and the not so little ones. And when I became an adult, he was always there behind the scenes*

*with an encouraging message and a virtual smile.*

*I had never really thought about how interesting my path to a relationship with Mr. Lamb had been until this week. I was a giddy admirer, a six year old, Texas student of another teacher. And a decade later we became teacher and student, mentor and mentee, and friends.*

*Admiration, joy, confidence, and love...all feelings you imprinted onto my heart. You were a pillar in my foundation and a ray of sunshine in my life. I am forever grateful for you, Mr. Lamb. Tip, Tap, Toe away. I'll shuffle-hop-step with you again one day. Love, Shannon*

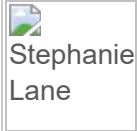
