Raymond Leo Coleman, 83, passed on December 16, 2024 at Tideland's Waccamaw Community Hospital in Murrells Inlet, SC.

He was born on February 14, 1941 in Bradshaw, WV to Noah and Mary Coleman.

Raymond attended Iaeger High School and soon after began working as a store manager for Jones & Spry Company in Bradshaw. Later he moved to Welch and served in several positions for Foremost Dairies. He retired from the dairy industry in 2004.

In addition to his parents, Raymond was preceded in death by brothers Alva, Gleason, Sonia, Glen, Eugene, John and Noah Jr., sisters Janita, Glenna and Othella.
